# Working with Others, Well

### THE CHALLENGE

A health economics (HE) consultancy contacted us because they had won a network meta-analysis (NMA) project with a large pharma client and were originally planning to execute a targeted (ie, nonsystematic) literature search to inform the analysis. As they were about to start, their client realized that it would be more efficient to execute a full systematic literature review (SLR) that could do double-duty: inform their NMA and support an upcoming NICE submission. Since the consultancy did not have SLR expertise in house, they reached out to us for support.



## THE STRATENYM SOLUTION

Stratenym worked with the HE consultancy on a successful pitch to their client with the added SLR component. Throughout the SLR process, we ensured the consultants conducting the NMA had the resources they needed. We executed the requested SLR, then since the collaboration worked so well, we were asked to undertake two more SLRs in other indications with the same consultancy and pharma company.

### THE SUCCESSFUL OUTCOME

The SLRs we conducted were used (1) to inform the NMAs, (2) to support successful NICE submissions for all three indications, and (3) in two publications. The pharma client got lots of leverage from that work!
